Clarification sought regarding applicability of Dimapur district in view of recent administrative reorganisation.	It is clarified that Dimapur district has undergone administrative reorganisation, and the areas previously falling under Dimapur now include the newly created districts of Chümoukedima and Niuland. Accordingly, plantation activities may be considered in these districts, subject to availability of suitable land, community consent, and adherence to the provisions of the EoI.
